The Nigerian Social Enterprise Impact Summit (NSEIS) was designed to address this structural gap.

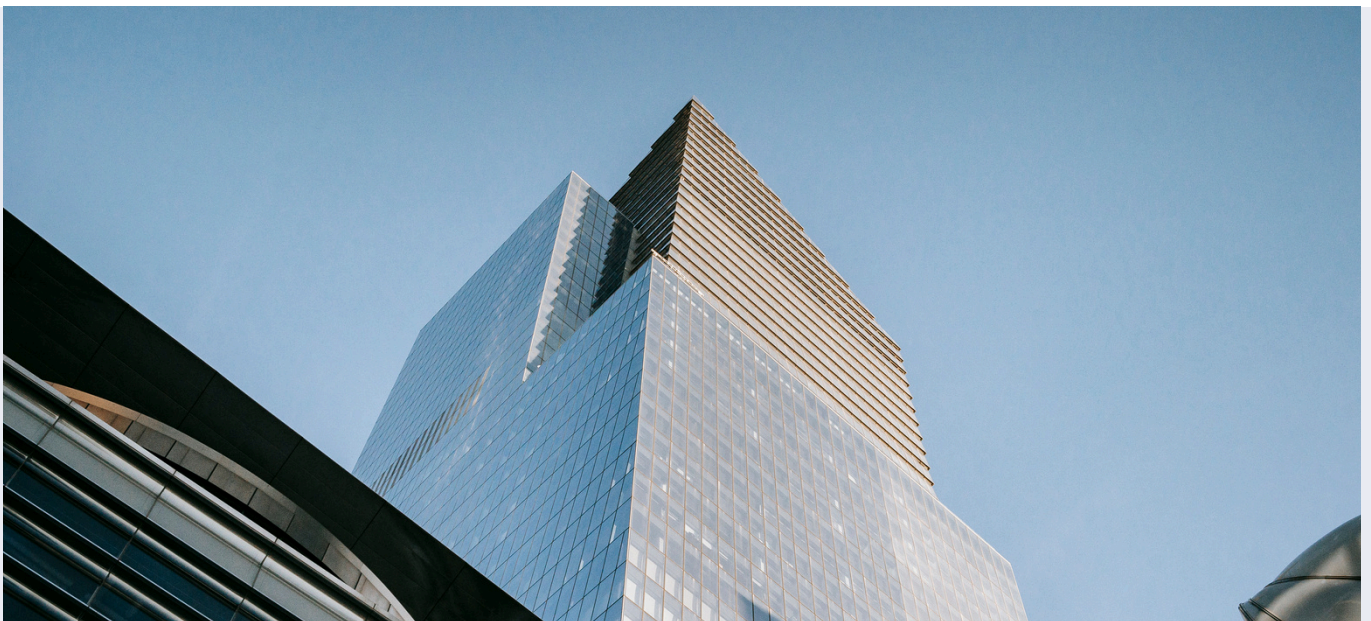
NSEIS is not an open event.

THE INSTITUTIONAL PARTICIPATION MODEL

Nomination-Based Participation

Participation in NSEIS is strictly by institutional nomination.

Individuals do not register independently.

Partner Institutions nominate between 3 and 10 delegates who are actively engaged in:

- Social enterprise
- CSR implementation
- Community development
- Youth leadership
- Faith-based social action
